When **Hurricane Wilma** hit Florida late in October 2005, Key West received several feet of water in low lying areas. The Lower Keys also experienced an unusual flood, it occurred twice. First, as the storm crossed toward the State of Florida it pushed water across the keys from south to north. As the storm finally moved into the Everglades, all the water that had been pushed by the storm, was then released as Wilma crossed the peninsula. The water then raced back across the Lower Keys a second time and going out to sea.
